The Vandalia Food Pantry

They will give a quick training, a t shirt, and have you sign a waiver before taking you into the Northridge area to serve. There are two shifts. St. Vincent de Paul – Dayton

St. Vincent has been designated as a drop off/storage/inventory location for items donated towards storm relief. As such their need for volunteer has increased.

WAREHOUSE

1. They are setting up daily (M-Fri) schedules of volunteers to begin **Monday June 10 and continuing until no further need.**
2. Volunteers needed to sort donations (primarily clothing) at the 945 S Edwin C Moses location next to the Job Center
3. Shifts of 3 people to no more than 8 people for shifts of two hours each.
4. Daily timeframe is 9am-3pm. This means the work will end by 3pm.
5. Any individual or group with students under age 17 must have an adult present. (parent, coach, teacher, etc.)
6. Volunteers must wear closed-toes shoes.
7. They will require names of individuals or names of teams/groups but no other paperwork is required for this special relief-oriented role.
8. They are particularly interested in recurring volunteers, (i.e 1x per week for the next few months) but are happy to have help.
