PLEASE NOTE: Only 250 attendees will be permitted per Mass. To avoid reaching max occupancy, please consider attending Mass on a weekday rather than the weekend if your schedule allows.

WHY HAS THE MASS SCHEDULE CHANGED?

The rationale for this schedule is to make Mass more available during the week. Remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is lifted for the foreseeable future. The Sunday 6pm Mass is being temporarily canceled since it is the least attended Mass in the last 3 years.

I AM CONCERNED ABOUT RISK-EXPOSURE. WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Those who are at risk, apprehensive, or hesitant that they or their family might become sick from gathering in a group are advised and encouraged to remain home and participate via a live-streamed Mass. Also, if you are sick or experiencing symptoms of any sickness, please be charitable to your fellow Christians and stay home.

WILL ONLINE SERVICES STILL TAKE PLACE?

Yes, although we will no longer continue with the Liturgy of the Word recordings, we will soon be live-streaming the 9am Sunday Mass from St. Christopher. More information will soon be communicated as details are developed. Please continue to check the parish website for more information on how to celebrate Mass with us via live-stream.

CAN I COME TO THE CHAPEL TO PRAY?

Yes, the Chapel will remain open for private prayer during office hours.

CAN I RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION?

Beginning on Saturday, May 30, 2020, the Sacrament of Confession will resume every Saturday from 4:15pm to 4:45pm. Please follow the guidelines as listed in the **Healthy Worship Protocol** section below.

HAS THE POLICY FOR COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND CHANGED?

By a directive given by Archbishop Schnurr, in order to further protect the health of the sick and of those administering to them, individuals will not be able to pick up Communion or take Communion to others. Communion is to be reserved only for the critically ill or dying. Similarly, the administration of the Sacrament of Anointing will also be reserved for the critically ill and dying. Admission of clergy varies by institution. Please check with the institution prior to calling the parish office to make sure clergy will be admitted.

ARE MASSES BEING SAID FOR CURRENT MASS INTENTIONS?

Yes, Mass intentions will resume per Mass. If you have any questions or needs regarding Mass intentions, please contact our office administrator, Bonnie Prine.

HEALTHY WORSHIP PROTOCOL

In order to protect the health and safety of all joining together in worship, several guidelines and changes have been made regarding \underline{how} we will gather. Please review these important changes towards practicing healthy worship as a gathered community:

MASKS: Face masks are advised and encouraged to be worn at Mass.

MASS OCCUPANCY: Temporary capacity for Mass is 250.

Once the church is at capacity, the front doors will be locked.

ENTERING CHURCH: Enter church through the front doors only.

- The front church doors will be unlocked 30 minutes prior to the start of Mass (except on Saturday when confessions begin at 4:15).
- The back doors will remain locked.
- Due to the need to physical distance, gathering is not permitted in the Gathering Space.
- > Upon entering church, please pick up a bulletin, enter the nave, and find a seat.
 - A worship aid is in the bulletin. Please take the bulletin and worship aid with you when you leave. Do not place them back in the Gathering Space.
 - o Missalettes and hymnals have been removed from the pews because of sanitizing issues.
- Follow the directions given by the ushers.

SEATING: Households should sit together, but everyone else needs to keep 6 feet apart.

> The Day Chapel will <u>not</u> be used for additional seating because it is a small space.

DONATIONS: Collection baskets will not be passed.

- > The tower will be placed in the Gathering Space to drop in your donations.
- You may also mail or drop donation envelopes at the office.

OUR FATHER/SIGN OF PEACE:

- Do not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Do not physically shake hands, hug, or kiss at the Sign of Peace (exception is with members of your own household).

COMMUNION:

- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will wear masks when distributing communion.
- Ushers will continue to release pews for reception of communion, and there will be a **new communion procession** to eliminate congestion.
- Those not receiving communion will not receive a blessing since touching is forbidden during the pandemic.
- Communicants are to receive in the hand and <u>not</u> on the tongue.
 - o This is a safety issue for all who are receiving communion after you.
- The cup will not be offered for communion.

EXITING CHURCH: At the end of Mass, ushers will dismiss you by rows.

- Please heed their directions and do not gather in church.
- You may exit through any door.

SANITIZING OF THE CHURCH

Please know that the church will be cleaned and disinfected to the best of our ability after all Masses. However, we can't guarantee anybody's health. As much as we anticipate celebrating Mass with all of you present in church, our first concern is your well-being. Please talk with family, friends, and medical professionals about returning to public worship at Mass. Then, ask the Holy Spirit to help you make the wise choice of when is the right time for you to return to worship at Mass. We will be here for you.

COMMUNICATION

HOW CAN I GET THE LATEST UPDATES AND INFORMATION ABOUT THE PARISH DURING THIS TIME?

SACRAMENTS

WHAT IS THE STATUS OF BAPTISMS, WEDDINGS, AND FUNERALS?

We will resume celebrating all baptisms, weddings, and funeral services at St. Christopher Church. However, receptions will not be permitted at this time. All Sacramental Masses and services are expected to observe the guidelines (as apply) in the **Healthy Worship Protocol** (see page 3).

WILL THERE BE A MASS TO CELEBRATE FIRST HOLY COMMUNION OR TO RECEIVE NEW MEMBERS INTO OUR PARISH COMMUNITY?

Yes, plans are currently in process to safely celebrate these important and long-awaited Sacraments. Information will first be communicated by the directors of each Sacrament to the participants. More information will be communicated to the parish community once plans have been confirmed. Please continue to pray for those receiving various Sacraments.

PARISH MINISTRIES & GROUPS

WILL PARISH SMALL GROUPS BE STARTING BACK UP SOON?

No, not at this time. Currently the permission to resume public worship pertains to Mass and Sacramental celebrations. While we are eager to resume our regular faith formation groups, we are unable to safely nor effectively maintain a healthy worship space if we resume our small group gatherings.
